



Firstly to the aid of a club member, when a member was being collected from home to go to an event, the Lion was found on the kitchen floor in great pain with a broken collar bone after falling.

Secondly, at the end of March 2021 Lion President Dave Williams was at home with wife Jill when she realised that Dave was having a stroke. FAST had been learned at St John training and Jill remembered: -

Face Is it distorted? Can you SMILE?

**Arms Can they be raised above the head and held there
Speech Slurred speech, not getting the words out.**

Time for 999

Jill immediately made a call to the ambulance service and realising time was essential, it was agreed the quickest way to get treatment was for Jill to take Dave in the car 5 miles to the A&E department. On arrival at the hospital, who had been alerted, a stroke nurse took Dave to Rescus and after an assessment Dave was given a new Stroke drug – all within 45 minutes of realising his condition. Within a few hours the Drug was working and Dave’s condition improving. 5 days later Dave was allowed home – To relax!!

Thank you St John, the 4 hours basic training and refreshers courses Do Save Lives

HEREFORD LIONS

Hereford Lions Club has raised money for a specialist breast pump to help mothers who are unable to feed their baby direct from the breast.

The club has bought a £1,600 electric breast pump for Hereford County Hospital's neonatal service to be loaned to mothers, in addition to a number of breast pumps already available to them. Sian Thorne, children community nursing team leader at Wye Valley NHS Trust, said: "This is a brilliant donation from the Lions Club. We provide support for all mothers with their infant feeding choices. However, some women who want to breast feed are not able to do so long term and the Lions pump will help overcome this."

Lions president, Sian Bayliss, herself a retired nurse (right presenting the pump to Sian Thorne) said: "Helping with a baby's start in life supporting mum's who want to breast feed but are having difficulties was an important project for the club."

The club's fundraising events for community support have been abandoned since Covid19 flared up in March last year and it is hoping to be able soon to re-start the weekly car boot sales, the annual golf tournament on August 6 and the monthly pub quiz at the Bay Horse.

2020 WAS a year like no other for service clubs all over the world. Many appeared to go into hibernation in the hope of waking up when it was all over.

But as the *Wotton Times* discovered in conversation with publicity officer Ciara Harding and some of her colleagues, that was certainly NOT the case for Wotton Lions.

"Wotton Lions have increased their membership by 60 per cent, lowering the age profile and increasing diversity," said Ciara, who lives in Wickwar and who joined the Lions after a stint at the helm of Blue Coat School's PTA. We've maintained fundraising income at 90 per cent of 2019 levels and, more importantly, we've been able to increase the community support by 14 per cent!"

Jess Turner, Wotton Lion's youngest member at 26, transferred to Wotton in 2018 and was elected an incoming president in May.

"Our membership success was identifying what we needed to do as a club," said Jess. "We recognised that our age profile was a problem and we needed to bring in more female members. It was all about making sure we had a future – the more members we have, the more we can increase our presence in the community."

The proof of such a mission is already showing, she adds, with people now asking to join the community group.

Back in the non-Covid day, the Lions were known for their regular weekly meat draw in The Star. Running since 1999, the draw was made every Friday night. Former KLB teacher and long-serving member Tony Haworth was the driving force behind the draw and he was supported by a rota of Lions to help sell the tickets.

But with the Star forced to close, Chris Anthony, one of the newer members, had the idea of taking the draw online.

"Given a good activity record for online communication, the Lions had built up a mailing list of people who'd entered or supported their activities," said Ciara. "The response showed how they appreciated the Lions."

In fact, profit from the draw, which began online in May, proved to be three times the average from the venue.

"Nine months on, it's still more than they raised

on a regular Friday," Ciara added. "With the loss of so many of our other activities, the raffish has been a vital part of increasing community support; it's great to see how the community support us."

So how is 2021 looking, from the tail end of the third lockdown? Bright, they unanimously say.

"We've shared £1,000 towards cost of headsets for online learning to all our local primary schools and donated £250 towards an outdoor play activity for Blue Coat, as well as £1,000 for a 'trim trail' at the British school. Currently, we are also planning work groups to repair buildings at Bournstream Play area."

And there's more in the diary. "We're hopeful that the planned 10,000m Under the Edge run can take place on 19th September as it is important part of their fundraising," says member Julie Jenner. "Hosted by Renshaw, it was great to see so many people taking part in 2019, as a member of the Wotton Trotters, I know there's lots of excitement for this year's event!"

For the weekend of July 30th to August 1st, plans are also coming together for a cycle event, with more information on this shortly.

And no update on this hyperactive fundraising group can omit the key role played by Rotary.

Rotary was named following a competition in local primary schools – and has proved to be a popular addition to the team, his "offspring" finding loving homes in the area.

Wotton Lions was chartered in 1977. Forty-four years on, the team is certainly making sure it has a future to play in our community.

"I'm genuinely so proud to be part of this amazing pride of Lions!" says Ciara. It's an emotion every member certainly deserves to share.

No man went to mow?

In the wake of its climate emergency declaration, Charfield Parish Council has thrown its weight behind a green campaign to leave verges in the villages uncut this spring.

Clerk Paula Evans said that, having discussed 'No-Mow May', full support has been agreed for the scheme.

"The verges in the village are managed by South Gloucestershire Council, who are aware of the initiative," she said. "Some of the verges are already regularly left un-mowed for periods because of the presence of important wild plants."

She added: "Gardening volunteers have also planted the verges with bulbs, and the bank as you enter Charfield have been full of snowdrops this spring, with daffodils and other flowers now replacing them."

However Charfield's largest parish-owned space is the burial ground, and the council has agreed it would be inappropriate to not mow the grass around the plots for those visiting the graves of loved ones.

"Nevertheless, more than half the burial space is currently managed for wildflowers, and there is a significant bee-friendly planting regime. Just last autumn, the Parish Council replanted the rose garden with a dozen new 'bee-friendly' rose bushes."

Litter spells road risk

PROBLEMS with litter brightening Charfield's railway overpass have been causing a headache for parish councillors.

"The Parish Council is aware of issues of littering in the area, and South Gloucestershire Council has mooted the idea of extending tall fencing into the overpass," said parish clerk Paula Evans.

"Littering has been an increasing issue across the parish over the recent lockdown, but the Parish Council is concerned that enclosing the overpass could lead to more people walking over the road bridge, because of the perception of danger that the darker route would present – and that this could lead to increased incidents on the bridge."

In the event that the emergency services are called to your home they are trained to look for two stickers (one on the inside on your front door and the other on your fridge) which will alert them to the bottle and its possibly life saving content.

2. Place the completed form back into the bottle.

It's **FREE**. All costs are paid for by local Lions who fundraise to generate the money to offer this life saving service.




