

Over the last number of years Shirley LC, Solihull LC and Acoccks Green LC have combined their forces and co-operated on a number of occasions. This is especially the case with the 3 Lions Beer Festival, where members of all 3 clubs work together. It makes the whole Lions experience so much more fun.

Shirley Lions Food Bank support

This year Shirley Lions targeted new estates that have been established in Shirley with four new routes. We decided to target these estates with a two pronged attack.

Of course it was foremost a Food Bank collection, but, every activity is a membership activity and this part was very much part of this as well. It might have been for most people the first time they saw the Lions logo and we hope it will not be the first one and that brand recognition will follow soon.



Coventry Godiva Lions in partnership with primary and secondary care conducted two well-attended health awareness events to support local communities and make people aware of what support services were available

to access.

The first event was on the 24th of September and was conducted during the National Organ Donation week in collaboration with National Health Services Blood and Transplant (NHSBT), the organisation that oversees organ donation and transplantation in the UK.

This had the overarching message: "Save a life afterlife". Members of the Transplant Services from: University Hospitals Coventry and Warwickshire (UHCW) NHS Trust and representatives of the Organ Donation Ambassador Programme were present to educate members of the public.

The Lions, "Message in a bottle" was also promoted.









The second event on the 1^{st} of October, sought to promote the theme for World Diabetes Day 2021-23 – "access to diabetes care" by aiming to raise awareness of the impact of diabetes, how to prevent getting the disease and how to access local services for support.

Free point-of-care blood tests were done to check blood sugar, HbA1c and lipid profile. Members from the NHS Coventry and Warwickshire Integrated Care Board and experts from UHCW participated.

At both these events, there were: height, weight, blood pressure and BMI check; real-time assessment of heart health and promotion of healthy lifestyles.

A wide spectrum of health care professionals was at hand to provide relevant advice to the attendees to manage identified risks and encourage behaviour change.

These events represented excellent examples of implementation of the recently launched integrated care systems as recommended by NHS England and passage of the Health and Care Act (2022). Each of these provided a forum for participating organizations to network among themselves as new relationships were fostered to continue to help the community.

On 6th October 8 young people from 1st Isham & Orlingbury Scouts, supported by Lion Barbara, were helping to clear up the local churchyard. This included weeding, cutting back hedges and refurbishing the Bug House.

This was later expanded into a regular team collecting time sensitive food items from local supermarkets and delivering to the food bank and still later expanded again into the collection and delivery of flowers which although still in good condition were past their sell by date and therefore due for binning.

We are now involved in a further initiative, a weekly meet and greet session where the local people are invited in for a hot drink and a chat or maybe assistance with a problem which could impact on their mental health in the warm and friendly atmosphere of the Centre.

proud to have recently celebrated 50 years of service to the community at The Ritz, Desborough. The event was attended by current members, partners and those associated with the Club over the years. During this time the Club has raised and donated hundreds of thousands of pounds to mainly local causes additionally organising many

entertainment events for the elderly, children plus those with special needs. Club President George Potter said "We hope to continue to serve our community for many years to come and thank the public for their support and generosity.

Redditch Lions have been collecting for Children in Need since its inception in 1980.

Every year they buy an assortment of BBC Children in need items from the organisers out of our welfare funds and we sell these items to local residents who collect them each year.

Redditch have been doing this for 42 years and estimate that we have now collected over £40,000 for this charity.
