Membership I make no excuses for stressing membership as during their respective years all my predecessors did. Mission 1.5 serves to concentrate the mind on our goal of membership growth. Without membership growth we will not be able to achieve the heights of service that we currently deliver. New members help to regenerate our clubs and this needs to be a continuous process, even for those new clubs mentioned earlier. We also always hear from members that our Subscriptions are too high. It is a vicious circle as membership growth drives up income which is needed to meet spiralling costs, without that growth our membership subscriptions will rise.

Branch Clubs Some members may feel uncomfortable about having new members who are considerably younger than themselves. Please consider whether a Branch Club may be appropriate. This approach has many advantages, primarily in that only 5 new members are required as opposed to 20 for a new Club. A potential benefit for the Branch Member is that the parent club undertakes all the administration. We have a shining example of such a Branch Club in our District at Bradley Stoke, parented by Bristol Brunel.

Unfortunately, there are occasions when members feel that their Club has come to the 'end of the road'. I would ask any club considering closure to consult with our GMT, 2 VDG Sue Wilding, who will advise on the appropriate action to take. Whilst we never like to lose members it occasionally must be recognised that personal circumstances may necessitate resignation. As an organisation we would however like the legacy to be a reinvigorated club instead of closure. We in this District are blessed with having the services of our Global Extension Team led by IPDG Rav Sandhu who has now opened or revived numerous clubs and is open to the challenge. The advantage of re-invigorating an existing Club is that 10 new members are required to achieve this objective, as opposed to 20 for the New Club.

New Clubs There are currently a number of initiatives throughout the District developing New Clubs. The team built by Rav and Lion Fran Stary is working hard to bring about new clubs. They would of course welcome suggestions and assistance from clubs in the areas where they are working. I think it appropriate to recognise and thank the assistance the Lions of Warwick and Kenilworth are giving Lion Fran. If you have a town nearby that you think may be a suitable location for a new or branch club, please let us know. The Extension Team will welcome these suggestions although may not necessarily have the capacity to look at the viability immediately, any offers of assistance would I am sure be most welcome as well.

Event Planning Now that Autumn is approaching many clubs will be planning their Bonfire and Christmas events. Early in this planning process needs to be the completion of Risk Assessments and consideration of insurance implications. Do not leave insurance to the last minute as this may become more difficult now that we will be dealing with a formal insurance broker who works office hours. In any case the

cost of insurance is required for budgeting purposes. Do not leave insurance to the last minute.
