105CW YOUTH PROJECTS

The end of the calendar year is a busy time for our district with many youth projects approaching the judging stage. Entries for Peace Poster & Peace Essay, Young Ambassador of the Year and Lions Roar have all been received and have been submitted to the various judging panels.



LIONS ROAR is a Multiple District project that is run in conjunction with 8billion ideas. 134 primary schools across Multiple District 105 were received, with young people submitting their ideas on how they would improve the environment. 8 clubs from across our district sponsored 18 primary schools, all of whom submitted incredible ideas and solutions to many different environmental issues.



The judging panel had a very difficult job but after much deliberation Pembroke Primary School was chosen as the winning entry for 105CW. The school was sponsored by Chepstow & Caldecot Lions Club who have supported this youth project since it was rolled out across the Multiple District 3 years ago. The winning team can be seen in the picture along with their teacher who had the amazing idea of a solar powered backpack that could be used to help supply power to all the different electrical items we use daily. It could even be used to support the electricity used within their school.



YOUNG AMBASSADOR of the YEAR judging took place at National Headquarters on Sunday 26th November 2023. We are delighted to announce that Leyla Mughal, sponsored by Shirley Lions has been selected as our Young Ambassador candidate for this Lions year.

Black Mountains Lions Spread a Little Christmas Cheer

The Black Mountains Lions has been busy packing and delivering Christmas gifts for 100 local people needing to be cheered-up over the Christmas and New Year period. The Christmas treat bags contain biscuits, sweets and chocolates and a Christmas card from the Black Mountains Lions. The bags will be delivered by Lions during the 9 days between the 14th of December and Christmas Eve. We hope that these small gifts will remind people that we are thinking of them at this time of year. Christmas can be a difficult time for the bereaved and those who live alone. Our area is very rural and sparsely populated, it has many isolated settlements in the mountains. The recipients of the bags live in Hay-on-Wye, Talgarth, Clyro, Lowes, Dorstone, Brilley, Rhosgoch, Llanigon, Glasbury,

Three Cocks and Bronllys, plus many isolated hamlets.

Choosing people to receive the gifts was carried out by our local charity partners, except for those who are in-patients at our local Community Hospital at Bronllys who automatically get a bag. People receiving the Christmas treats were selected by both Hay and District Dial-A-Ride, a charity who provide a transport service to their members who are either disabled, elderly or carless; and by Powys Association of Voluntary Organisations (PAVO). The Black Mountain Lions have

previously supported Dial-A-Ride and are doing so again to help them buy a better small bus.
