105 CW LIONS visit 103 Normandie

Having struggled to find a new way to give a meaning to the twinning between our district and 103 Normandie after Brexit complicated the transport of the spectacles that were collected at Convention, the idea was formed to travel to Normandy and assist our fellow Lions with the picking and selling of tulips in aid of cancer research. We also wanted to have a look at Medico, the French Lions owned spectacles recycling operation in Le Havre.

On 11 April various ferries traveling from Portsmouth to Caen had some Lions on board. In total 10 UK Lions arrived in Caen, ready to pick tulips the following day in a field with French Lions not far from Bayeux. In the afternoon a number went to Bayeux to admire the tapestry while others went to sell at a supermarket in Douvres-la-Délivrande. Just behind what was D-Day's Juno/Sword beach. So on the way there Lion Richard Stannard with wife Tina and myself with Lion Claire passed Bény-sur-Mer Canadian War Cemetery. As the car was full with tulips, we were able to leave a floral tribute to our fallen liberators.

We had a beautiful day in the sun selling tulips, which went smoothly. The next day we did it again in 2 locations. The location in Caen was supported by a large number of Leo's and a number of scouts. In the evening we had dinner together with Lions from the Caen Reine Mathilde club, celebrating the success of our sales. We sold out. and passed the takings of 2023, so our trip paid off!

Then on Sunday participants did different things, a number travelled to Mont St. Michel, while others visited a chateau.

Monday we visited the Medico facility where French Lions recycle 5 million spectacles annually and also take in medical items like wheelchairs, beds and distribute them worldwide. It is quite an operation with 7 full time staff. I understand that UK Lions are studying ways how we can renew the cooperation which got disturbed in the wake of Brexit. It would be nice if we can work together again and ensure that our spectacles will get to their end destination handled by Lions.

The aim of the trip was to support our fellow Lions and enjoy the good food and touristic sites Normandy has to offer. The trip delivered on all the points and the plan is to repeat this in April 2025. LOCAL GIRL, YOUNG VOLUNTEER, WINS TWO AWARDS

Local girl, Rosa Wetherall, has received awards from both Southam and District Lions Club and Rugby Borough Council. Rosa, who is a student at Southam College, became part of the Young People in Service scheme, led by Lion Dave Thing in 2023 and this year is led by Lion Ben Wide. Since then she has put in over 100 hours of voluntary work, thus receiving the Gold Certificate and £100 from the Southam Lions club. At the Southam Lions' meeting on Wednesday 6 March, Lion Ben Wilde introduced Rosa and her family and explained that Rosa had completed 104 voluntary hours within the community involved primarily with Football Coaching for young people at Rugby Borough Football Club, particularly helping children with additional needs and with groups of both under eight and twelve years. The Chair of the Football Club wrote to Ben outlining his delight that Rosa was being recognized for her enthusiastic input and even suggested that the future of the Club was in good hands.

On Wednesday 10 April Rosa attended the Rugby Borough Council Awards and won the Rugby Young Volunteer Award for 2023, the award was sponsored and presented by the Rugby Rokeby Lions Club.

Kenilworth Lions Use DIY Skills for Refuge UK

Kenilworth Lions have recently been exercising their DIY skills and interior design “knowledge” assisting Refuge UK to make properties recently acquired through the Dispersed Accommodation project, welcoming and attractive places for their clients to bring themselves and their children to safety. In this activity we were very grateful for the assistance of the Kenilworth Soroptimists, who do fantastic charitable work in the area, and have very close ties with Refuge UK.

The work involved putting up curtain poles / rails, shelving, window blinds, video doorbells, post-boxes, TVs, and a bit of furniture assembly; converting the refurbished, but sterile, houses into homes to live in. Some of the properties were fully wheelchair accessible and suitable for disabled residents, which required slightly different approaches to both design and installation. The final part of the package was achieved with the help of another wonderful charity, Kidsout UK, who have access to loads of large toys and playhouses. We were able to collect literally a vanload of interior, and exterior toys and play equipment – these were VERY well received by the children at the properties.

Kenilworth Lions are predominantly a grant-awarding club, so it was a pleasant change to be able to offer physical assistance to this very worthwhile cause.

Brian Hornsby, a member of Balsall Common Lions club, was cared for by the hospice during his 10-year battle against prostate cancer.

It has taken approximately five years, but we are proud to announce that the Man Shed at the Marie Curie Hospice in Solihull is finally OPEN for business. In truth, the Man Shed was formally opened in 2020. Note the date – it was ready the day before lockdown, and remained unused until September 2023, and it now going strong once more, where on a Tuesday about a dozen men gather on a weekly basis.

And finally, on 16 January, representatives from the seven clubs of the Solihull Seven finally got to visit the Man Shed, and the Lions Plaque mounted proudly on the exterior.
